Activity Number: A 1.3	Duration: 25 min
Description of activity	Breaking the ice: Setting the stage
Learning outcomes:	Explain the forms of motivation for MA activities. Describe and interpret how these forms of motivation can drive MA activities based on different scenarios.
Aim of activity	<ul> <li>Evaluating forms of motivation and expectations for MA</li> <li>Sharing knowledge</li> <li>Discussion</li> </ul>
Description of activity	Motivation Survey
Material Required:	Balloons, Cards, Pens, Paper, Laptop and Screen, PowerPoint Presentation
Step-by-step instructions of the activity	<ol> <li>Different cards are placed on the table containing the major forms of motivation for MA.</li> <li>Participants form a group of 4/5 persons.</li> <li>Each group chooses two cards from the selection.</li> <li>The group opens both cards and members discuss and determine which form of motivation has a greater influence on farmers and rural people to engage in MA activities.</li> <li>The Moderator analyses results to identify common themes and motivations</li> </ol>

Aim of activity	<ul> <li>Problem solving</li> <li>Brainstorming</li> <li>Discussion</li> <li>Co-learning</li> </ul>
Description of Activity	Workshop
Material Required:	Pens, Paper, Laptop and Screen, PowerPoint Presentation
Step-by-step instructions for the activity	<ol> <li>Cards are placed on the table containing challenging factors that mitigate lifelong learning in MA.</li> <li>Participants form a group of 4 or 5.</li> <li>Each group selects one card from the lot.</li> <li>The group opens the card and offers solutions</li> </ol>
