### Guidance Service Provider in Multifunctional Agriculture

#### Module 4: Motivation of Farmers, Students, and Others in Rural Populations

**Duration:** 6 hours (per 45-minute face-to-face training), 2 hours self-preparation (learner reads the contents of the module)

#### OVERVIEW

Multifunctional Agriculture (MA), also known as farm diversification, seeks to ensure the broadening of agriculture and non-agricultural activities within the farm by supporting farmers' incomes and sustainable rural development. Multifunctional Agriculture offers a viable strategy to rethink and rebuild rural areas in a way that develops the capabilities of farmers and rural people and strengthens their resilience. It facilitates diversified enterprises and promotes rural regeneration while supporting women and young entrepreneurs to flourish, ensuring rural places are attractive to live and work in.

This module focuses on teaching farmers, students, and others in rural areas about the motivations for MA activities. It provides an opportunity for participants to foster business innovation and entrepreneurship. The learning outcomes are to help participants understand these motivations and equip them with the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and competencies for the successful diversification of their farm business. Students will learn the motivating factors and learning processes driving MA entrepreneurship and how to employ digital and green competencies to guarantee food safety, animal welfare, soil health, climate protection, and biodiversity conservation. Participants in this module will:

- Learn from a team of practitioners, academics, and experts who are leading European and international projects in Agriculture
- Collaborate with like-minded people to co-create green and digital solutions in agriculture for sustainable development
- Promote Multifunctional Agriculture entrepreneurship for a positive impact on rural development and vitality
